A colourful, wide-ranging lecture exploring the work of British war artists in WWII. Includes a chance to ask James related questions, and to buy cards, books and art prints by some of our war artists.

At the outbreak of WWII, National Gallery director Kenneth Clark set up a scheme whereby the British government would employ artists to record the war effort. From Eric Ravilious and Edward Ardizzone to Laura Knight and Evelyn Dunbar, a remarkable group of artists created an unforgettable and immensely varied body of work. Widely exhibited at the time in Britain and overseas, this vast collection is not only a historical document, it is also a timeless testament to the human spirit and the capacity of people to endure hardship.

This year's education project focused on Mussorgsky's inspirational work "Pictures at an Exhibition", the centrepiece of the HPO concert on July 16 (see page 10).






#### DRAWN TO WAR

Margy Kinmonth's film is the first major feature length film to be made about Eric Ravilious, the much loved but vastly underestimated landscape painter who became the first British War Artist to die in the Second World War. Featuring conversations with such notable Ravilious admirers as Ai Weiwei, Grayson Perry, Alan Bennett and Robert Macfarlane, the film recounts a life as compelling and enigmatic as his art, set against the dramatic wartime locations that inspired him. Made in co-operation with Imperial War Museums, the story is told in Ravilious's own words through a wealth of material drawn with the blessing of his estate from a treasure trove of private correspondence and previously unseen archive. The film also features the voices of Freddie Fox, Tamsin Greig, Jeremy Irons and Harriet Walter.' Foxtrot Films

#### ROBBIE ROBSON SEXTET JAZZ SESSION





#### THE BULL INN | FRI 21 JUL | 8PM | FREE

Trumpeter Robbie Robson is a graduate of Leeds College of Music where he was awarded the John Coates Prize for Outstanding Musicianship, and of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Robbie was a national finalist in the Young Jazz Musician of the Year 1999, and the runner up in the Perrier Young Jazz Musician 2000. Robbie leads his own band 'Dog Soup', but also regularly works with other bands. He has also played with John and Jacqui Dankworth, Cleo Lane, Jamie Cullum, Phil Woods, Tony Bennett and JTQ.

He plays regularly with saxophonist Josephine Davies, winner of the 2019 Parliamentary Award 'Jazz Instrumentalist of the year'. Josephine Davies is a musical artist at the forefront of the UK contemporary music scene, constantly pushing the boundaries of jazz. Now becoming equally known as a composer, her unique voice is a blend of classical, jazz and folk music, creating an intensely dynamic sound infused with the Nordic quality of her Shetland roots.

For this session, the pair will be playing with some of the South Coast's leading jazz musicians: John Donaldson on piano, Greg Heath on saxophone, Simon Thorpe on bass and Milo Fell on drums.

#### LIZ FLETCHER QUARTET JAZZ SESSION







Liz Fletcher was born in Kingston Upon Thames into a musical family (her parents were singers, her stepfather a saxophonist). Liz is a highly respected, well established UK jazz singer who has performed at Ronnie Scott's, Pizza Express, Cadogan Hall and many venues, festivals and concert halls globally. Influenced by Peggy Lee and Julie London with a love for Ella Fitzgerald and Chet Baker's phrasing, Liz adds her own musical twist to many of the songs from The Great American Song

She'll be joined for this session by long-time collaborator Phil Capone on guitar, the ubiquitous Simon Thorpe on bass and long-standing leading session musician Marc Parnell on drums.

#### 2pm: BYRON WALLEN'S 4 CORNERS **PROJECT**

Widely recognised as a seminal figure in world jazz, Byron has travelled the world recording, teaching and performing alongside legendary musicians such as George Benson, Andrew Hill, Chaka Khan, Hugh Masekela and Courtney Pine. He has performed in East Africa, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Nigeria, Indonesia and Belize (his parents' homeland).

Raised in a musical environment, as a child Byron learned classical piano, euphonium, flute and drums before deciding in his mid-teens that the trumpet would be his instrument of choice. His work draws inspiration from contemporary jazz and indigenous African and Asian cultures.

As a composer, he has been commissioned by organisations as varied as the Science Museum, the BBC, the National Theatre and FIFA. He has also created soundscapes for Universal Pictures, Warner Bros and Games of Thrones. He has received the BBC Jazz Innovation award (2003), the coveted Paul Hamlyn Award (2017) and has been nominated for the MOBO award several times.

For this session, he will be joined by his band Four Corners. On guitar is BBC New Generation Jazz Artist Rob Luft. On bass is Paul Michael and on drums is the great US drummer Rod Youngs, who was formerly with Gil Scott-Heron. They'll be playing music from their most recent album. Portrait: Reflections

on Belonging, which led to them being shortlisted for Jazz Ensemble of the Year in the Parliamentary Jazz Awards 2020.

It explores issues of ancestry, diasporic journeys and cultural roots. Landmarks of blues, mode and groove are explored and reinvented, with further inspiration from early Renaissance music, Central and East African rhythm and polyphony, and the music of Miles Davis, Wayne Shorter and Thelonious Monk.



#### 3.30pm: KIRK LIGHTSEY / STEVE **WATTS DUO**

Veteran American pianist Kirk Lightsey was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1937. He is one of the best exponents of the traditional Detroit jazz piano style, alongside two great figures who are no longer with us: Hank Jones and Tommy Flanagan.

During the 60s he worked in Detroit, his home town, and in California, where he frequently accompanied singers such as Melba Liston, Ernestine Anderson, O.C.Smith and Damita Jo. But it was his work with some of the greats that led to him being seen as a jazz giant: judge a man by the company he keeps.

He played and recorded with the great Sonny Stitt, oftentimes collaborator with Dizzie Gillespie and Miles Davis. He recorded five albums with the difficult (to put it mildly) but highly talented trumpeter and singer Chet Baker. He made an album with legendary

guitarist Kenny Burrell. And he spent four years (1979 – 83) touring with the great Dexter Gordon.

In the late 1980s he was a member of the hugely influential jazz super-group The Leaders, and over the years he has released 14 albums as leader of his own projects. Since he moved to Paris at the beginning of the century, he has continued to work with a range of major artists, including Gregory Porter.

He'll be playing in this session with longtime collaborator, UK bass stalwart Steve Watts. Steve has been playing jazz on the British scene for over 25 years, during which time he has worked with many musicians of international stature, including Django Bates, Iain Ballamy, Julian Arguelles, Kenny Wheeler, Stan Sulzman, Jim Mullen, Richard Rodney Bennett and many more.



#### 5pm: DENYS BAPTISTE QUARTET

Born in London of St Lucian parents in 1969. saxophonist Denys Baptiste studied music at the West London Institute (Brunel University) and the Guildhall School of Music, where he was taught by former Jazz Messenger (and Battle Festival artist) Jean Toussaint.

From the moment he joined the London jazz circuit, Denys displayed extraordinary talent, energy and commitment. Over the years he has soared in his development as a soloist and bandleader, earning enormous respect from his peers and leading Time Magazine to describe him as an "icon of British jazz".

AllAboutJazz has said of him: "His colossal talent - based on a powerful technique and an ability to improvise fluently and effortlessly across a wide range of musical styles – is matched only by his unfettered energy which takes him and his audiences into the musical stratosphere. An evening with Denys guarantees a display of unsuppressed expression, ranging from sweet "saxuality" to breathtaking, edge-of-your-seat virtuosity."

A much sought-after soloist, Denys has played/recorded with some of the biggest names in jazz including McCoy Tyner, Bheki Mseleku, Courtney Pine, Gary Crosby, Julian Joseph and Jason Rebello, among many others. He has recorded five albums, each of which received rave reviews and multiple award nominations. He'll be joined for this session by his regular

He'll be joined for this session by his regular quartet which features Jazz FM Instrumentalist of the Year Nikki Yeoh in piano and keyboard, long-time collaborator Larry Bartley on bass and the dynamic and powerful Rod Youngs on drums.

#### 6.30pm: JASON REBELLO / TIM GARLAND DUO

This formidable duo featuring two of the UK's most revered jazz musicians – keyboardist Jason Rebello and multi-reedist Tim Garland – is the culmination of three decades of close friendship and frequent collaboration.

Jason Rebello already had three critically

Jason Rebello already had three critically acclaimed albums under his belt by the time he was 23. Five years later, in 1998, he became Sting's keyboard player, touring the world and recording with Sting's band for six years. He then spent another six years with guitar legend Jeff Beck's band, while still finding time to work with artists such as Peter Gabriel, Phil Collins, Pee Wee Ellis, Joss Stone and Madeleine Peyroux.

In 2013, Jason decided he wanted to re-

establish himself as a solo jazz artist. He has since released two albums, the most recent of which, 'Held', won best new CD in the British Jazz Awards.



Tim Garland's first break as saxophonist was joining Ronnie Scott's band age 23. Later he was to join Chick Corea as a regular member of several globe-trotting projects over a seventeen year period. Playing tenor and soprano saxes, bass clarinet and flute, he also won a Grammy for his symphonic orchestrations on Corea's "The New Crystal Silence" album from 2007.

He combines jazz with modern classical composition. He has fulfilled commissions from several of the world's top orchestras, including the LSO, The Royal Northern Sinfonia and the BBC Concert Orchestra. Along the way he has won multiple nominations and awards.

Now the pair feel it's time for their duo format to blossom. "I just feel that we have to make music together," says Rebello, "it's a natural outcome of two people that have known each other for a long time."

#### 8pm: DARIUS BRUBECK QUARTET with special guest BRANDON ALLEN

We are talking jazz royalty here. Like his legendary father Dave, Darius Brubeck is a renowned pianist. But has also enjoyed a lifetime of varied international experience as band leader, composer, teacher and broadcaster.

Born in San Francisco, in the '70s and early '80s Darius led his own groups and toured with his father and two brothers Chris and Dan. In 1983 he moved to South Africa where he became Professor of Jazz Studies at the University of KwaZulu-Natal and played and toured with some of the country's leading musicians. In 2006 he moved to the UK where he founded the Darius Brubeck Quartet, which over 16 years has become a successful and popular group in the UK and beyond.

On saxophone will be Brandon Allen, who as well as being a much in demand sideman is also an accomplished composer and arranger. Since moving to London from Australia in 2000, he has worked with a huge range of artists including Eric Clapton, Paloma Faith, Mica Paris, Jools Holland, Gary Barlow and Neil Diamond,

Bass player Matt Ridley has been a core member of the Quartet since its inception. He has recorded three studio albums and two live



albums with them and toured extensively in Europe, Asia and Africa. As a band leader he has made more albums, one of which – The Antidote – was nominated for Best Album in the 2022 Parliamentary Jazz Awards.

Drummer Wesley Gibbens has also been with the band since it began. Born in Durban, his roots have led him to recording and touring with a number of legendary South African and Zimbabwean musicians.

#### 1pm: ART THEMEN QUARTET

Described by Dave Gelly in The Observer as "One of the tiny handful of undeniably perfect jazz musicians", Art Themen has been a much loved figure on the British jazz scene for over 50 years, famously combining jazz with his duties as a consultant orthopaedic surgeon.

He first made an impact in the '60s as a member of the pioneering band Alexis Komer's Blues Incorporated. Then in 1974 he began an association with Stan Tracey that was to last for 25 years and showcased Themen's consistently creative (cont.)



saxophone playing in bands ranging in size from quartet and sextet to full jazz orchestra.

He has continued to work at the highest level both in the UK and on the international stage. His most recent album with this current guartet, Hanky Panky, was launched last summer to rave reviews.

On drums is veteran Dave Barry, whose work with various ensembles and big bands has taken him all over the world. He was a member of Don Weller's Quartet and his big band for 16 years.

On bass is Dave Green, whose first public performances were with his childhood friend Charlie Watts. He played with Humphrey Lyttelton for 20 years and went on to work with Stan Tracey. He has regularly backed visiting American stars at Ronnie Scott's, including Coleman Hawkins, Ben Webster, Roland Kirk and Sonny Rollins.

Completing the line-up is pianist Gareth Williams, who has been receiving increasing critical and public acclaim since becoming a professional musician in the 1990s. He has worked closely with jazz singer Claire Martin as well as with a range of major international greats and top British musicians.

Together, these four pack a highly experienced punch.

#### 2.10 pm: ROBERT MITCHELL 'TRUE THINK'

Robert Mitchell is an award-winning pianist, composer, arranger, bandleader and published poet who has built a formidable reputation for working across creative genres. Over his 30 plus years entrenched in the art of music, Robert has released 12 albums of his own projects, participated in over 100 projects as a sideman, has performed/toured in 40 countries and is achieving a growing reputation as an inspirational educator. He was recently appointed Professor of Jazz

Piano at the Guildhall School of Music.

During his career, he has worked with an extraordinarily wide range of jazz artists, including opening for Wayne Shorter at the Brighton Dome and Branford Marsalis at the Barbican. In 2019 he was Musical Director of a BBC4 tribute to the great '60s TV programme Jazz 625 Live: For One Night Only, which won Best Music Programme at the 2020 Broadcast Awards.



He always has a range of projects on the go. For this session he'll be appearing with his new electronic/song ensemble TRUE THINK (Truth inc / Truth Ink), which features Swedish vocalist and songwriter Liselotte Östblom on vocals, award-winning Zayn Mohammed on guitar, multi-genre bassist and keyboard player Tom Mason and renowned drummer and percussionist Saleel Raman.

They'll be performing music from their new double album Hold The Light / The New Resistance, featuring powerful songs of protest, love and peace. They blend electronic, jazz, RnB, spoken word, film and folk influences together to create a unique

One observer described a recent performance as "absolutely incredible - searing musicianship and precisely declaimed poetry combined with a rich instrumental palette and impeccable ensemble playing, all punctuated by epic, euphoric improvisation. Life changing stuff."

#### 3.20 pm: LAURA JURD DINOSAUR

Multi-award-winning trumpeter and composer Laura Jurd has made a huge impact on the British jazz scene since she emerged a decade or so ago. She's been a BBC Radio 3 New Generation Artist, won the Worshipful Company of Musicians Dankworth Prize for Composition in 2011 and Young Jazz Musician award in 2012 and was 'Instrumentalist of the Year" in the 2015 Parliamentary Jazz Awards.

Her music celebrates and innovates the rich traditions of jazz and folk music, whilst often reflecting her love of two very distinct influences, The Beatles and Stravinsky. Her compositions dig into something primal, earthy and human, whilst taking twists and turns that both invite surprise and evoke the inevitable.



For this session, she'll be playing with her regular band Dinosaur, which first came together ten years ago. It features Elliot Galvin on keyboards, Conor Chaplin on bass guitar and Corrie Dick on drums. Together, they have earned a reputation as some of the best UK jazz musicians of their generation.

Their first album, Together as One, was nominated for the Mercury Prize in 2017. Since then they have produced two further albums which have been lauded with huge critical praise. Their most recent, To The

Earth, was described by Jazzwise as "a memorable meeting of eclectic contemporary musicianship and jazz's deepest roots".

Having played at some of the world's most iconic jazz festivals including North Sea, Molde and Montréal, the band goes from strength to strength as they enter their 11th year of trumpet-led, improvisatory magic.

#### 4.30 pm: ORLANDO LE FLEMING AND ROMANTIC FUNK



World renowned bassist Orlando le Fleming was born in Birmingham but brought up in Devon. Both of his parents are professional musicians, his mother a cellist and his father a composer. But his first ambition was to be a professional cricketer, an aim he realised by playing for five years in the minor counties. But when he was offered a place at the Royal Academy of Music, his lifelong passion for music won out.

While based in London, his virtuoso technique, boundless creativity and powerful beat led to him touring and recording with the likes of Jason Rebello, Julian Joseph, Jean Toussaint and Ian Ballamy. Then in 2003 he moved to the United States, where

he became one of the most in-demand bass players on the New York jazz scene, playing and recording with many of New York's finest

Orlando has also had great success as a leader. His drum-less OWL trio (with long term associates Will Vinson and Lage Lund) gained plaudits across the board for its hushed, intimate atmosphere. One of his more recent projects, Romantic Funk, presents a pastiche of classic fusion sounds and ideas, updated by Le Fleming's signature palette of polyrhythm and abstract exploration.

This session will feature the latest incarnation of that band, including long term collaborator Will Vinson on saxophone, together with a couple of UK heavyweights, sought-after drummer James Madden and former Pater Gabriel keyboard player Tom Cawley.

They'll be playing excerpts from the band's most recent album The Unfamiliar, which was described by one critic as "Superb... a fresh mix of energy, intelligence and groove".

What more could you want?

#### 5.40 pm: ELAINE DELMAR QUINTET featuring JIM MULLEN

Elaine Delmar is a "Grand Dame' among British female jazz singers and has been recognised as such by some of the great and the good: "One of the ageless, evergreen singing stars that we have... as beautiful and talented as ever... she's marvellous", is how Michael Parkinson described her. Humphrey Lyttelton said that she "Truly defines the word class..."

Born in Hertfordshire, UK, Elaine was raised in a strong musical environment. Her father was the renowned trumpeter Leslie 'Jiver' Hutchinson, a leading influence in the jazz and dance band movement in Britain from the 1930s onwards. After initially learning

classical piano, she followed a natural progression towards singing and became a vocalist in her father's own band at sixteen.

It was soon apparent that her vocal talent and natural affinity with the stage would lead her to triumph in many areas of the entertainment world. As well as singing, she's had a successful career on the London stage and on Broadway. She received critical acclaim as a straight actress for her role in Map Of The World at the National Theatre.

Her stellar recording career has spanned some 60 years. She's equally at home in the concert hall - she appeared with Andy Williams at the Free Trade Hall in Manchester and Michel Legrand and the LSO at the Royal Albert Hall - and in smaller venues. She makes regular and very popular appearances at Ronnie Scott's.

For this event, she'll be supported by guitar legend Jim Mullen, a major figure on the UK scene in his own right. With him will be three more musical luminaries: Barry Green on piano, Bobby Worth on drums and Simon Thorpe on bass.




